For further details regarding the current index offences and an analysis of criminal history please refer to the Criminal Profile Report completed April 13, 2000.

REASON FOR TRANSFER

On March 24, 2006 Stewart's Parole Officer was contacted by a Police Officer who had been monitoring a particular website. According to this officer an audio recording, purportedly of an interview between the Parole Officer and Stewart, had recently been posted on this site. It was subsequently determined that Stewart had, unbeknownst to his Parole Officer, recorded a discussion between the two and subsequently managed to provide this recording to the operators of the identified website.

The recording begins with Stewart identifying himself and indicating that he is about to attend an interview with his Parole Officer V. Magee. The subsequent discussion primarily consists of Ms. Magee addressing Stewart's admitted use of T.H.C while incarcerated. In response to the information provided by the Police Stewart was admitted to the Administrative Segregation Unit at Collins Bay Institution.

In accordance with established protocol Stewart's Security Classification was reviewed following his admission to segregation. During the course of this review the undersigned discovered a recent entry on Stewart's Preventive Security file.

This entry pertains to information, provided to the Preventive Security Office, regarding Stewart's conduct in the Visits and Correspondence Department at Collins Bay Institution. According to this report Stewart had discreetly passed an item(s); described as "little square computer files", to one of his visitors. It is further noted that Stewart had, on previous occasions, passed information in a similar manner. The source further notes that there is "all kinds of funny stuff going on between the two of them even on the phones". It is inferred that "the two of them" refers to Stewart and the visitor who allegedly received the "computer file(s)".

As explained in the Security Reclassification section of this report Stewart's re-assessed Classification Scale reflects a Maximum Security rating. This rating was computed without application of the override component. Were the Case Management Team to maintain Stewart at a Medium Security Institution adequate justification would be required to override the established rating of Maximum. As the C.M.T. believes that Stewart has engaged in conduct that is contrary to the behavioural expectations of a Medium Security facility there is no justification for application of the override component. Given these developments Stewart no longer meets the Offender Profile Criteria for a Medium Security Institution and is consequently being recommended for Involuntary Transfer to a Maximum Security Institution (i.e. Millhaven).

COMMENTS FROM RECEIVING INSTITUTION

S. MacDonald, A/C.C.M. at Millhaven Institution, provided the following comments via Outlook message:

Stewart's behaviour warrants a maximum security designation. It is noted that Mr. Stewart was determined to be a medium security offender in January of 2006, and since that time the only noted incidents are in relation to the tape recording incident, having excessive Nicorette gum and having cell effects that are not listed on his card. It is noted that Mr. Stewart admitted on the tape recorded interview with his Parole Officer that he uses drugs while incarcerated. This information is not new to the C.M.T. as Mr. Stewart has consistently provided positive urinalysis tests in the past. There is no evidence of violent behaviour, nor that Mr. Stewart poses a threat to the safety and security of the institution. This case was consulted with S.I.O. S. Crisp on 2006-05-29, and she concurs that with the information at hand, there is no evidence that Mr. Stewart is not manageable in a medium security environment.

Should CBI confirm that Mr. Stewart is a maximum security offender, there are no incompatibles or protective custody concerns that would preclude transfer to MI. Mr. Stewart has indicated that he will not participate in programming as his case is under appeal. In the event that this transfer is effected, please ensure that information sharing is completed prior to transfer."

A/P.S.O. R. Parker was consulted by the undersigned on May 8, 2006 and he is in agreement with the C.M.T.'s recommendation that Stewart be Involuntarily Transferred to a Maximum Security Institution.
